Key Bible Verses

Genesis 18:1-15

- Genesis 18:1-2a "The Lord appeared again to Abraham near the oak grove belonging to Mamre. One day Abraham was sitting at the entrance to his tent during the hottest part of the day. 2 He looked up and noticed three men standing nearby."
- 2. Genesis 18:10-12 "Then one of them said, 'I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah your wife will have a son.' Sarah was listening to this conversation from the tent. 11 Abraham and Sarah were both very old by this time, and Sarah was long past the age of having children. 12 So she laughed silently to herself and said, 'How could a worn-out woman like me enjoy such pleasure, especially when my master—my husband—is also so old?'"

- 3. Genesis 18:13-14 "Then the Lord said to Abraham, 'Why did Sarah laugh? Why did she say, "Can an old woman like me have a baby?" 14 Is anything too hard for the Lord? I will return about this time next year, and Sarah will have a son."
- 4. Genesis 18:15 "Sarah was afraid, so she denied it, saying, 'I didn't laugh.' But the Lord said, 'No, you did laugh."

Message Summary

Pastor Dave reflected on the story of Abraham and Sarah, highlighting their journey of faith and the fulfillment of God's promise despite their advanced age and initial disbelief. Their story shows that God's power is not limited by human conditions and that His promises will be fulfilled in His timing. Through their story, we are reminded that nothing is too hard for God and that we should position ourselves to notice His work, run to meet needs, and live generously.

Sticky statement

Small changes that will make a big difference: Position yourself to notice Run to the need Live Generously
